Club Meeting: Wednesday 8th May 2024

We are pleased to welcome **Heather Moore**, who will show us the creative techniques of lino printing. Hartlepool Art Gallery, Christ Church, Church Square, Hartlepool, 7.00pm – 9.00pm (doors open 6.40pm)

Heather became a professional artist in 2018 when she sold her first limited edition print and opened up her online shop. Based in Newcastle in her home studio, she is inspired by the coastline and nature around her – particularly the amazing beaches we have in the North East. Her surroundings feed her passion for creating colourful limited edition Lino prints with high quality papers and oil-based inks.

In recent years, her focus has been on printing layered coastal artworks in gorgeous blues and greens and lustrous gold. She is a firm believer that colour can enhance mood so she selects colours that will bring joy. This is how she sees the world. The colours she uses aren't necessarily a direct representation of the look of the coast but of how it makes her feel positive emotions that she wants to pass on to those viewing her work.

She aims to operate low waste systems, recycling test prints and misprints into collages rather than sending them to landfill. She also uses papers that are 50% cotton and cleans her tools using vegetable oil rather than harsh chemicals.

Since leaving teaching in 2022 and becoming self-employed, she has realised that she is a total workaholic and needs to schedule in time for herself. When she's not working, she enjoys taking strolls on the beach with her family, eating too much dark chocolate and reading.

Touring Exhibition at Hartlepool Art Gallery, 18th May – 24th August 2024

The Gallery will be hosting a touring exhibition 'Drawing Attention: Emerging Artists in Dialogue', presenting some of the most compelling and talented artists working in contemporary drawing, displayed alongside highlights from the British Museum prints and drawings collection. In this surprising and thought-provoking selection, emerging artists take the medium of drawing in new directions and use innovative approaches. A wide range of techniques and practices are represented, including drawings using make-up on face wipes by Sin Wai Kin and a drawing made by chalk collected

Alongside works by celebrated artists will be a selection from Hartlepool's own fine art collection chosen by Young Producers and brand new work created by students from the Northern School of Art.

<u>Turner: Art, Industry and Nostalgia – Laing Art Gallery, Newcastle, 10th May – 5th September 2024</u>

Turner's *The Fighting Temeraire* (1839), on loan from the National Gallery, will be the centrepiece of the exhibition, which explores the rise of steam power and industry in Britain. This is of particular relevance to the North East, with ship building still very much part of the identity of the region. Admission charges apply.
